Selling liquor to miners
Frederick Starbuck & another
July 31st A. D. 1865, this day came Susilla
Blackburn and filed her affidavit
against Frederick Starbuck, to wit: That on or
about the 4th day of July A. D. 1865, at the county of
Highland, and in the incorporated village of
Greenfield, Frederick Starbuck and another, did
unlawfully sell intoxicating liquors to one
Ernest Allen he being a Miner, said selling
being without the written order of either parent
or Guardian or family physician &c.
Whereupon I issued a warrant for the said
Frederick Starbuck, and delivered it to F. F.
Mast Marshall of the incorporated Village of
Greenfield, and at the same time issued
a subpoena for Ernest Allen.
July 31st 1865. Warrant returned in due time, I
have the Body of the villain named F. Starbuck
in Court for trial. Fee Service 40, Arrest 40-
Mileage 20 - Attending Trial 100 Signed F. F.
Mast Marshal.
The Defendant Frederick Starbuck craved
an examination, whereupon I required him
to enter into a recognizance in the sum
of one hundred dollars for his appearance
at the next ^{term of the} Court of common pleas to be
holden in and for said county of Highland
and not depart the Court with out leave
whereupon I gave the defendant F. Starbuck
with Joseph Puff his Security and entered
into a Bond for the aforesaid sum of one
hundred Dollars for his appearance as
aforesaid.

I also required Ernest Allen to enter into a Bond

Frederick Newbeck v
 Defendant

July 21st A. D. 1865: This day came Emmea Blackburn who being duly sworn according to law depose and testify that on or about the 4th day of July A. D. 1865: at the County of Highland and incorporated village of Greenfield, Frederick Newbeck and another, did unlawfully sell intoxicating liquors to one Summerfield Eckman, a minor - said selling being without the written order of either the parents, guardian or family physicians of him the said Summerfield Eckman, they the said Frederick Newbeck and another well knowing the said Summerfield Eckman to be a minor. And further said not.

Whereupon I issued a warrant for the arrest of the said Frederick Newbeck, and delivered it to F. F. Mark Marshal, and at the same time issued a subpoena for Summerfield Eckman and delivered it to F. F. Mark Marshal. July 21st 1865. Warrant returned, indorsed, I have the body of the within named F. Newbeck in Court for trial - Fees service 40 Arrest 40. Mileage 20, Attending Trial 100 = 200. F. F. Mark Marshal Subpoena returned indorsed served personally by reading to the within named Summerfield Eckman. Fees service 25 Mileage 20 = 45. F. F. Mark Marshal.

The Defendant Frederick Newbeck waived an examination, whereupon I required him to enter into a recognizance in the sum of one hundred dollars for his appearance on the first day of the next term of the Court of Common Pleas to be holden in and for the said County of Highland, and not depart the Court with leave thereof. Whereupon came the defendant with Joseph Wolf his security and entered into a bond of one hundred dollars for his appearance as aforesaid. I also required Summerfield Eckman to enter into a Bond in the sum of fifty dollars for his appearance on the first day of the next term of common Pleas Court in and for said County of Highland and not depart the Court without leave.
