At the **Memorial Services, under the direction of Gibson Post, No. 180, G.A.R., May 30th, 1882 at Greenfield, Ohio**, a large crowd had gathered at the center of town to hear orations and music to honor those fallen in war. At the conclusion of the band playing “Hail Columbia”, the line of march was taken up for the purpose of decorating the graves at the old **1st Street Cemetery**. First came Seidensticker’s Band of Cincinnati, followed by the decorating committee. All then proceeded with baskets filled with bouquets, the leaders carrying wreaths, after these came the speaker’s carriage containing Hon. M.J. Williams and Rev. A.U. Beall, then the members of the G.A.R. Post and civilians.

[Please note that this would only include burials prior to 1882.]
